The goal of the Wisconsin Opioid Project ECHO® (Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes) is to improve the capacity of community providers to provide patients with opioid use disorder the high-quality care they need, when they need it, close to home.

Building Knowledge and Practice

The Wisconsin Opioid Project ECHO® has four steps.

1. Use videoconferencing technology to leverage resources.
2. Share best practices to reduce disparities.
3. Apply case-based learning to master complexity.
4. Evaluate and monitor outcomes.

Join Our Learning Loop

Free videoconferences are held the third Friday of every month from 12:30-1:30 p.m. These sessions link interdisciplinary specialist teams with community providers. Each session has a topic. There is time for a collaborative discussion on submitted patient cases. This virtual knowledge-sharing network creates a learning loop:

- Community providers learn from specialists.
- Community providers learn from each other.
- Specialists learn from community providers as best practices emerge.
